In 1995, the International Seminar on Islam and Confucianism: A Civilizational Dialogue at the University of Malaya marked a pivotal moment in Malaysia's history, initiating a dialogue that transcended religious and philosophical boundaries. Now, 28 years later, Al-Ghazali Chair of Islamic Epistemology and Civilisational Studies and Renewal, ISTAC-International Islamic University Malaysia, the Centre of Regional Strategic Studies (CROSS), and the Southeast Asia Research Centre for Humanities (SEARCH) proudly announce the reorganization of the Islam-Confucianism Leadership Dialogue (ICLD2023).


Building on the legacy of the 1995 event, the ICLD2023 represents a milestone in the ongoing dialogue between Islam and Confucianism. This renewed effort brings scholars, experts, and practitioners from both traditions together, creating a platform for open and respectful exchanges. The event is a testament to the belief that fostering mutual understanding between civilizations is essential for a harmonious and interconnected world.

The ICLD2023 emerges in a world where intercultural understanding has evolved from a mere ingredient for "peaceful coexistence" to a fundamental pillar for global stability and progress. Recognizing the risk of exacerbating power imbalances and fostering hegemony without meaningful dialogue in the face of globalization, the dialogue aims to contribute to equitable and inclusive international relations.

In the spirit of knowledge, wisdom, and learning encompassed in the word "enlightened," the ICLD2023 explores the theme "The Idea of Enlightened Leadership: Islamic-Confucian Perspectives." This theme reflects the commitment to delve into the shared values and beliefs that exist between Islam and Confucianism, paving the way for a world built upon mutual understanding.

The significance of this event extends beyond the dialogue itself. It aligns with Malaysia MADANI's spirit of inclusivity and the China Belt & Road Initiative's goal of enhancing connectivity and cooperation among diverse nations. The ICLD2023 serves as a catalyst for promoting global understanding and appreciation of shared values.







Al-Ghazali Chair of Epistemology and Civilisational Studies and Renewal ISTAC-IIUM

The Al-Ghazali Chair of Epistemology and Civilisational Studies and Renewal is presently located at the International Institute of Islamic Thought and Civilisation (ISTAC), a postgraduate Institute of International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) established on 29th September 1987. Its current holder is Emeritus Professor Datuk Dr Osman Bakar, who occupied the Chair since September 2018. The present Chair is a renaming of the original Al-Ghazali Chair created by Professor Tan Sri Syed Muhammad Naquib al-Attas, ISTAC's Founder-Director, in 1993 and officially launched on 14th December 1993 at its old campus in Jalan Damansara, Kuala Lumpur. During the official launch YAB Dato Seri Anwar Ibrahim, then the President and Chairman of the Board of Governors of IIUM and Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister of Malaysia, announced the appointment of al-Attas as the first occupant of the distinguished Chair.

The title "Al-Ghazali Chair of Islamic Thought" was chosen both in honour of al-Ghazali (1058-1111) as one of the greatest thinkers in Islamic history and in recognition of Professor Al-Attas as a leading world scholar of Islamic thought who was deeply influenced by al-Ghazali. Professor al-Attas occupied the Al-Ghazali Chair for nine years from December 1993 till 2002, the year his academic position at ISTAC came to an end. The Chair has not been occupied since then until September 2018 when Professor Datuk Dr Osman Bakar was appointed by IIUM as its second occupant.

As the second holder of the Chair, Professor Osman Bakar who is also an authority on al-Ghazali, identifies its concentration with the disciplines of epistemology and civilisational studies. Hence, the Chair's new title "Al-Ghazali Chair of Epistemology and Civilisational Studies and Renewal." The Chair is now dedicated to research, publication, and training of doctoral and Masters students in Islamic thought and civilisation as well as inter-civilisational dialogues. More specifically, the Chair is highly visible in delivering lectures and convening seminars and conferences on Islam-Confucianism dialogues.

Professor Tu Wei Ming

Chair Professor of Humanities and Founding Director of the Institute for Advanced Humanistic Studies at Peking University Professor Emeritus and Senior Fellow of the Asia Center at Harvard University

Tu Weiming, a distinguished contemporary Chinese philosopher and Confucian scholar, has left an enduring impact on East Asian philosophy and comparative thought. His intellectual journey is characterized by a dedicated pursuit of cross-cultural understanding and a commitment to bridging the gap between Eastern and Western philosophical traditions.

A notable achievement of Tu Weiming is his role as a leading exponent of Confucianism in the modern era. As a prolific author, he significantly contributed to the renaissance of Confucian thought, emphasizing its relevance in addressing contemporary global challenges. Beyond traditional academic boundaries, Tu Weiming dedicated himself to fostering dialogue and mutual understanding between cultures.

Tu Weiming also serving as a professor at Princeton University, where he founded the East Asian Studies Program. Later, he assumed the position of Director of the Harvard-Yenching Institute at Harvard University, emphasizing his commitment to academic exchange and cross-cultural collaboration.

As a scholar deeply engaged with Confucian humanism, Tu Weiming underscores the importance of ethical cultivation, social harmony, and the pursuit of virtue. His work delves into the rich tapestry of East Asian philosophical traditions, offering insights into the Confucian conception of the self, society, and cosmic order.

Tu Weiming's extensive publication record, including works like "Way, Learning, and Politics: Essays on the Confucian Intellectual" and "Neo-Confucian Thought in Action: Wang Yangming's Youth (1472-1509)," reflects the depth of his scholarship. These publications showcase his nuanced exploration of Confucian thought and its dynamic adaptation to contemporary challenges.

A pivotal moment in Tu Weiming's narrative occurred during the Dialogue between Islam and Confucian Civilizations in 1995 at the University of Malaya. Here, he encountered YAB Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim, the deputy prime minister at the time, illustrating the real-world impact of his ideas and the resonance of Confucian philosophy beyond academic circles.

Tu Weiming's legacy extends beyond academia, resonating with a broad audience interested in the intersection of philosophy, culture, and global ethics. His dedication to fostering cross-cultural understanding continues to inspire scholars, students, and thinkers worldwide.



Emeritus Professor Datuk Dr. Osman Bakar

Al-Ghazali Chair of Islamic Epistemology and Civilisational Studies and Renewal,

ISTAC-International Islamic University Malaysia

Osman Bakar, a doctorate in Islamic philosophy from Temple University, Philadelphia (USA) is currently Holder of Al-Ghazali Chair of Epistemology and Civilizational Studies and Renewal at ISTAC-IIUM. He is also Emeritus Professor in Philosophy of Science at University of Malaya. He was formerly Distinguished Professor and Director of Sultan Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Centre for Islamic Studies (SOASCIS), Universiti Brunei Darussalam. Professor Osman was also formerly Malaysia Chair of Islam in Southeast Asia at the Prince Talal al-Waleed Centre for Muslim-Christian Understanding, Georgetown University, Washington D.C., and Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic and Research) at University of Malaya. Dr Osman is author and editor of 44 books and numerous articles on various aspects of Islamic thought and civilization, particularly Islamic science and philosophy in which he is a leading authority. His most well-known books are Classification of Knowledge in Islam (1992) and Tawhid and Science (1992). His latest books are Colonialism in the Malay Archipelago: Civilizational Encounters (eds) (2020), Environmental Wisdom for Planet Earth: The Islamic Heritage (2022), and Islam-Buddhism Eco Dialogue (IBED): Application of Religion and Science to Ecology and Sustainability (eds) (2023). Dr Osman is a recipient of several prestigious awards, including Ibn Ishaq Al-Kindi Intellectual of the Year Award (National, 2020) and the 13th Farabi International Award on Humanities and Islamic Studies (International Top Researcher, 2022). His writings have been translated into numerous languages, including Arabic, Turkish, Persian, Chinese, Bosnian, Urdu, Bengali, and Spanish. He has been named among the 500 most influential Muslims in the world since 2009. He was made a Dato in 1994 by the Sultan of Pahang and a Datuk by the King of Malaysia in 2000.



Professor Nevad Kahteran

Prof. Dr. Nevad Kahteran is a Professor of Eastern and Comparative Philosophy in the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina. He has extensively contributed to the field of philosophy and was recently elected as the Vice-President of the International Society of Comparative Philosophy toward World Philosophy (https://www.cpwponline.org/home).

Nevad Kahteran is a scholar with a diverse academic background. He earned his bachelor's degree from the Islamic Theological Faculty in Sarajevo (now FIN) on February 11, 1992. Concurrently, he completed a degree in philosophy and sociology at the Faculty of Philosophy in Sarajevo on April 27, 1995. His academic journey continued with a master's thesis defense on December 28, 1995, titled "Philosophical Theologiké (Ibn Rušd/Averroes, St. Thomas Aquinas, and Maimonides)." Later, on July 27, 2001, he defended his doctoral dissertation on "Sophia Perennis (René Guénon, Frithjof Schuon, and Seyyed Hossein Nasr)."

Kahteran became a Hafiz of the Qur'an on April 19, 1999. His contributions extend beyond teaching, as he collaborated with institutions such as the Leksikografski Zavod "Miroslav Krleža" in Zagreb and co-edited and authored entries for "The Qur'an: An Encyclopedia" (Routledge, 2006) and "Encyclopedia of Love in World Religions" (ABC-CLIO, Santa Barbara, 2008). He obtained a Fulbright grant during the fall semester of 2006 at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa in Honolulu.

Kahteran engaged in various international study programs, including at Oxford University, Georgetown University, AUC-American University in Cairo, and Kyoto University. He has been a faculty member at the Faculty of Islamic Sciences since 1994/95, gradually advancing to the position of associate professor and, as of April 1, 2013, serving as a full professor. Kahteran has actively participated in international conferences and is associated with several academic organizations, such as being the vice president of the International Society for Comparative Philosophy in the USA and a member of HFD since 2021. His commitment to comparative philosophy is evident through his organization of international symposia and conferences.

Professor Dr Wen Haiming

Professor Haiming Wen received his Ph.D. in comparative philosophy from the University of Hawaii in 2006. He is now a professor at the School of Philosophy, Renmin (People's) University of China (RUC), and the Beijing Center (TBC, since 2007). He is the Associate directors of the Committee for Scholarship and Committee for Membership of International Confucian Association (ICA); Special Expert of Confucius Research Institute, Shandong Taishan Scholar; Director of Center for Studies of the Yijing (the Book of Changes) at Academy of Confucian Studies, Nishan World Center for Confucianism; Associate Editors-in-Chief of the Journals Studies of Confucianism (Kongzi yanjiu) and Confucian Academy (Kongxuetang).

Prof. Wen has published about 10 books in both English and Chinese, including Illuminating the New Version of the Ancient Treatise on the Book of Changes and the Unity of Three Continuities (Zhouyi Cantongqi) and Its Intentionality 新古本周易参同契明意(2022); Illuminating Intentionality Through `the Platform Sutra 坛经明意(2021); Comparative Context and Chinese Philosophy 比较境遇与中国哲学(2020); Illuminating Intentionality Through the Zhouyi: New Explorations of the Philosophy of the Book of Changes 周易明意:周易哲学新探(2019); Illuminating Daodejing and Its Intentionality 道德经明意(2019); Making Intentions Concrete: Dimensions of Confucian Ethics 儒家实意伦理学 (2014); two in English: Confucian Pragmatism as the Art of Contextualizing Personal Experience and World (Lexington, 2009); and Chinese Philosophy (Cambridge University Press, 2012); etc. His Chinese Philosophical Thoughts 中國哲學思想 (2010) has been translated into French, Spanish, Arabic, etc. He has also published more than 70 journal articles in both English and Chinese. He has been invited to present more than 100 papers in more than 20 countries allover the world. Over the years, he is active in promoting traditional Chinese philosophy to the world, and dialogue with many thinkers in various contemporary topics.



Professor Dr. Lasiyo, MA, MM

Professor in Eastern Philosophy, since 1997--Now Head of Department of Philosophy of Religion, at Faculty of Philosophy, Gadjah Mada University since 2015 – 2021 and 2021-2026

Prof. Dr. Lasiyo has been a prominent figure in Eastern Philosophy, holding the position since 1997 at Gadjah Mada University. Notably, he served as the Head of the Department of Philosophy of Religion from 2015 to 2021 and is set to continue in this role until 2026. His leadership extends to various roles, including heading the Department of Eastern Philosophy from 2010 to 2014, chairing the Postgraduate Program in Humanity from 2008 to 2009, and overseeing the Postgraduate Program in Philosophy from 2002 to 2007. He also assumed the role of Vice Dean in Academic Affairs from 1998 to 2001 and served as the Assistance Director of the Inter University Centre in Social Studies from 1996 to 1999. His educational background is extensive, earning a Ph.D. in Philosophy and Religious Studies from the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London, in 1993. Additionally, he holds a Magister Management from Universitas Islam Indonesia in 1998. With a rich teaching experience, he has lectured on Philosophy of Science and various philosophical topics at several universities. A prolific author, Prof. Dr. Lasiyo has published numerous works, including recent titles such as "Etika; Teori dan Implementasinya" and "Pembangunan Konfusianisme." Karakter Manusia dalam Perspektif Filsafat His publications encompass a wide range of topics, from Javanese culture and philosophy to the emergence of Confucianism in Indonesia, showcasing his expertise and contribution to the field of philosophy.

Dr. Nurul Ain Norman is a research fellow at ISTAC-IIUM and previously worked at IAIS Malaysia. She graduated from Universiti Malaya and specialises in Islamic Philosophy. She is multilingual and knows Malay, English, Arabic, Persian and French and is currently working on the oldest Persian manuscript (800 years old) in the Syed Muhammad Naquib Library. She was awarded the translation grant from the University of Birmingham (Global Philosophy of Religion Project) in 2021 and is also the secretary for the Malaysian Association for the Education of Philosophy and Thinking where she works with youth across the country to adapt critical thinking.

Professor Mohd Hazim Shah Murad

Malaysia

Professor Mohammad Hazim Shah holds degrees from the University of Manchester, the London School of Economics, and the University of Pittsburgh, USA. His extensive academic career at the University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur, saw him as a Professor and Head of the Department of Science and Technology Studies from 2001 to 2007. After retiring in 2015, he became a Senior Research Fellow until May 2016. Prof. Hazim served as Deputy Director of INPUMA in 2017 before joining Universiti Utara Malaysia. He was President of the Malaysian Social Science Association from 2010 to 2014, contributing widely to local and international journals on the history and philosophy of science, science-religion-culture relations, and comparative studies between Islamic and Western civilizations. He currently teaches philosophy at Universiti Utara Malaysia.



Professor Dato Mohamad Abu Bakar Malaysia

Sultan Mizan Zainal Abidin Chairholder at UniSZA (2019-2023) and former Head, Department of International & Strategic Studies, University of Malaya. He was also previously Visiting Professor at La Plata National University, Argentina, Al Mutawa Visiting Fellow at the Oxford Centre of Islamic Studies, England, and Fulbright Visiting Fellow at the University of Washington, USA. He too was Tun Abdul Razak Chairholder at Ohio University between 2005 - 2007.





Dr. Peter T. C. Chang is trained in the field of comparative philosophy and religion. Dr. Chang's current research looks at how a rejuvenated Confucianism could shape the evolving character of the Chinese milieu and in turn impact the global community. Based at the Institute of China Studies, University of Malaya, Dr. Chang is also analyzing the opportunities and risks associated with the Belt and Road Initiative. He is examining this from the perspective of China's soft power, specifically the Chinese traditional as well as popular cultural imprints upon the world at large in general, and Malaysia in particular. Aside from academic writing, Dr. Chang's publications include opinion pieces in media platforms such as the South China Morning Post.



MODERATOR: Dr Tee Boon Chuan Associate Professor, UTAR, Malaysia

Dr Tee Boon Chuan is an Associate Professor at the Department of Chinese Studies, University of Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR), Malaysia. He obtained his PhD in Philosophy from the National Central University, Taiwan. His research areas include Malay-Indonesian Intellectual History and East and Southeast Asian Confucian Studies.
