

Cooperation agreement

The parties to this cooperation agreement: COLLEGE OF OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH, accredited, Zagreb, Ul. I. Lučića 5, represented by the Dean, Liljana Dolšak, mr. sig. (hereinafter: the College of Safety) and UNIVERSITY OF SARAJEVO, Faculty for Criminal Justice, Criminology and Security Studies, represented by the Dean, prof. dr. sc. Nedžad Korajlić

Have agreed to enter into this:

INTERINSTITUTIONAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

I.

This agreement is intended to establish the framework for interinstitutional cooperation between the parties to develop the rules, procedures, and resources aimed at supporting international activities in higher education among institutions conducting affiliated programmes. Special attention is thereby paid to the mobility of teaching staff and students, European projects, joint programmes, and whole-life learning.

II.

In pursuit of the purpose of this agreement and the support for their business plans, the parties shall establish and develop permanent business cooperation, to address circumstances including the following:

- Exchange of knowledge through the exchange of educational and professional publications, teaching materials, other sources and resources;
- Cooperation in the development of study programmes and whole-life learning programmes;
- Cooperation in the development of distance learning models and electronic education;
- Professional and scientific cooperation in the preparation and realization of projects in the country and abroad;
- Stimulating joint research projects and organizing educational congresses;
- Teaching staff and student mobility;
- Cooperation between student organizations;
- Individual cooperation between subject area teachers, associates, and non-teaching staff.

III.

The parties shall realize cooperation under the reciprocity principle and plan all the activities at the beginning of the academic year, through the International Cooperation Office in the head institution.

IV.

The parties shall treat this agreement as the founding act regulating basic reciprocal business relations, while specific business deals and relations, including the commitments resulting thence shall be regulated by special contracts and agreements.

Reciprocal rights and obligations defined under special agreements or annexes to this agreement shall be in accordance with the provisions of this agreement and fair trade practice.

V.

The agreement is made for an indeterminate period of time, with the consent of both parties that it is made for a minimum of a year after entering into efficiency.

Either contracting party is authorized to terminate the agreement by written notice of termination delivered to other contracting party for any cause at least three (3) months prior to the expiration of the shortest agreement validity period.

VI.

The parties shall settle all possible disputes before the termination of the agreement peacefully, respecting business interests of both parties, in accordance with fair trade practice and university ethics.

VII.

Amendments to this agreement may only be made by the common written consent of both parties.

VIII.

The agreement is made in four (4) copies, two (2) for each contracting party.

IX.

The agreement enters into efficiency on date of its signature by both contracting parties.


